Clarksville Hosting 4th Degree Exemplification

Fr. William Morgan Assembly 2328 in Clarksville will be hosting a Fourth Degree Exemplification under the direction of our Worthy District Master on Saturday, October 9th, 2010. The Exemplification will be held at Columbus Hall, 709 Franklin Street, Clarksville, TN beginning at 2PM. We invite all eligible Third Degree members to take part. To be eligible, one must be a Third Degree Knight in good standing and a member of the Knights of Columbus for six months.

The fee for the exemplification will be \$70, which includes the fee to Supreme, Degree Certificate, Social Baldrick, Lapel Pin, and one ticket to the banquet. Additional banquet tickets will be \$25 per person for spouses, members, and guests.

There will be a program for the ladies while the exemplification is proceeding. There is no charge for the ladies' program. We will also have rooms available for the ladies to change for the Mass and banquet.

The schedule of events is as follows (Some subject to change):

1:30PM-Candidates should arrive at Columbus Hall to register for the exemplification.

2:00-Exemplification begins; Ladies' Program begins Social Hour following the exemplification in Columbus Hall before Mass

5:00PM-All meet at Immaculate Conception Church, 709 Franklin Street for Mass. Members with regalia are invited to be part of the Honor Guard. Seating will be reserved for our new Sir Knights, families, and all members and their guests. Mass begins at 5:30PM.

6:30 PM- Social Hour with cash bar (beer and wine) in the Family Life Center at Immaculate Conception, followed by the banquet.
